Weeds thrive on neglect

Redesign your backyard to create a manageable site. A weed-free garden is far more enjoyable than an untidy tangled mess and can be healthier for both you and your pets. Check out *Plant Me Instead* booklets for plants to use in place of environmental weeds.

Some neighbours even join their backyards together so they have a larger space to plant a native bush haven, for themselves and wildlife to enjoy. By working together they can keep weeds under control so everyone benefits.



Frightening fact: Auckland is the weedlest city in the world with over 220 environmental weeds.

Each year, at least another four plant varieties escape from gardens and reproduce in the wild. Don't let New Zealand become the weediest place on earth!
